- 3.Encourage OP's to operate in the field using low power, by doing this a person could provide emergency communication if the grid was down. Also they may find it a lot of fun setting up a station and operating in the field.

The NET was started June 14, 2018 after the devastating hurricane hit and wiped out communications on Port Rico.

As NET I operate from my home, when the weather conditions all me I set up my station in Hidden Valley Park. The park is located about 400 ft above the valley, with a noise floor about S2-3.
